

PAROCHIAL ADMINSTRATION ORDINANCE

PART IXA PROTOCOL

Adopted by the Diocesan Council in accordance with s86E of the Parochial Administration Ordinance

- 1. Where the management of real property forming part of Parish Trust Property may give rise to unreasonable risk, the Diocesan Council may initiate a review of the affairs or activities of the parish concerned.
- 2. Diocesan Council may determine to initiate a review under Part IXA of the Parochial Administration Ordinance, upon receipt of a written recommendation to do so. Any such recommendation must be countersigned by any two of:
 - 2.1. The Archbishop or Administrator; and
 - 2.2. One assistant bishop; and
 - 2.3. The regional archdeacon for the archdeaconry in which the parish property is situated; and
 - 2.4. The Secretary of Synod.
- 3. In determining whether to initiate a review of the affairs or activities of a parish, Diocesan Council may take into account:
 - 3.1. Correspondence received from stakeholders who have a legitimate interest in the proper upkeep of the Parish Trust Property, for example a local council authority, State Heritage, lessees or licensees of the whole or a part of the Parish Trust Property, adjoining property owners, etc.
 - 3.2. Correspondence received from members of the parish who have concerns about the management of the Parish Trust Property
 - 3.3. Correspondence, reports or notifications as received by Synod from the Synod's Property Manager/land agent
 - 3.4. Reports of incidents, hazards and near misses that have occurred on the Parish Trust Property
 - 3.5. Insurance claim(s) that have been made in connection with the Parish Trust Property



- 3.6. Correspondence from State or Federal government authorities, for example Safework SA, in connection with work practices engaged in in connection with the management of Parish Trust Property
- 3.7. Correspondence from regulatory authorities in connection with the proper operation of a cemetery which is under the control of a parish
- 3.8. The fact that a Housing Improvement Assessment or a Housing Improvement Order has been issued for property that forms part of Parish Trust Property
- 3.9. Any other correspondence or reports from external bodies or people concerning the state of repairs and/or safety of premises that form part of Parish Trust Property
- 3.10. Any other factors that are relevant to the state of repairs and/or safety of premises that form part of Parish Trust Property.
